





Child poverty in the world's richest nation continues to be a confounding paradox. Over the last five years, approximately 1.5 million children in America became poor, with the total now over 13 million. Comparative studies have found that it is worse to be a poor child in America than in any other developed country.

A 2004 study by the Annie E. Casey, Ford, and Rockefeller Foundations reported that low-income and poor families account for one-third of all of the children in American working families.

Descriptions of childhood poverty and its effects do not advance our understanding of this phenomenon or explain why it persists. In this four-volume set, interdisciplinary contributors reveal, explicate, analyze, and assess the facts to promote that understanding—and move us toward solutions.



Volume 1: Families and Children

Presents new perspectives on why and how childhood poverty persists. Describes the demographic and historical contexts of current child poverty. Addresses policies and legislation affecting low-income families.

Volume 2: Health and Medical Care

Examines the status of Medicaid, the lack of accessible and effective mental and physical health care services for the poor.

Volume 3: The Promise of Education

Reports on universal pre-kindergarten, Head Start, and the education of immigrant children.

Volume 4: Children and the State

Explores the effects of welfare reform, especially the issue of childcare and increased work expectations of poor parents. Looks at low-income families and the Family and Medical Leave Act, poor children and the Internet, and the increase in economic insecurity among low-income families who increasingly live on credit.
